1. Manage the perception. Many people see change as something that just happens, something that's "done to them" without their consent and outside their control. Sometimes this is true, but for most undertakings within a school environment teachers and administrators have some autonomy as to how (or even if) change is effected. The more opportunity and encouragement people are given to have some input, the more control they will feel and the more "buy in" will occur with the staff.

## **5 Strategies For Managing Change In Schools**

The federal Full-Service Community Schools (FSCS) program provides support for the operation of schools that improve the coordination, integration, accessibility, and effectiveness of services for children and families. The FSCS focus is on children attending high-poverty schools, including high-poverty

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rural schools.

## **Schools - Partnering for Change**

Use libraries to advocate for school-community partnerships and student learning. Libraries are important hubs and can provide meaningful connection points outside the school gates. A community resource map can come in the form of a hand-drawn map (use a graphic facilitator), Google Map, Mind Map or even a spreadsheet with some visual outputs.

For the purpose of sustainability - of both schools and staff - change must precariously balance between two points: improving and embedding. The first point is the need for continuous improvement and to avoid stagnation, and the second is the need to allow time for change to become embedded in the fabric of the school.

Strategies that we have found to be
